DESCRIPTION OF WP1

WP1 builds the foundation for developing the EU strategy by mapping the HL and (d)HL in Europe and beyond. To map the existing literature and best practices. Thus, to analyse the HL and (d)HL levels across member states and approaches to monitor and assess HL and (d)HL levels. The results will be integrated into the existing EU HL Atlas. Finally, the results will be shared with policymakers to support EU strategy, etc.

The objectives:

- To map EU health literacy (HL) and (digital) health literacy ((d)HL) research to assess the interconnections between HL and (d)HL contribution and health and well-being of citizens and what impact these factors have in relation to living a healthy life.
- To map best practices and identify champions
- To review existing monitoring mechanisms and indicators and synthesize data to to assess EU health literacy levels

TASK 1.1 - UCN (UNIVERSITY COLLEGE NORTHERN DENMARK)

Map (d)HL research

The mapping will focus on research on management of health data, integration of healthcare and social services and social innovation in (d)HL and will result in a clear understanding on the relation between (d)HL contribution (i.e., policies and initiatives/projects) and physical, mental and social health and well-being of citizens, with a special focus on specific target groups that will be involved in the co-creation of the EU Strategy (Section 1.2). Gender, diversity, and ethics dimension will be considered based on WP4 framework.

Aims

- Research – scientific papers – focus = research on management of health data, integration of healthcare and social services, and social innovation in (d)HL
- Non-academic works (e.g. Policy Precip by EuroHealthNet)
- Key EU Policies (e.g. EU eHealth Action Plan 2012-2020)
- Projects/Eu projects incl. H2020 IC-Health and DHE (Digital Health Europe)

TASK 1.1 - UCN- (UNIVERSITY COLLEGE NORTHERN DENMARK)

Map (d)HL research

Suggestions for recommendation

- Need to clarify the role of the partners in relation to the literature research – divide the search?
- Need to define HL and (d)HL
- Do we only search within the EU?
- Develop a search strategy (search protocol)
- Are we going to conduct the literature search with a focus on the specific target groups mentioned in the application?
- The framework from WP4 – when available?
- Develop a framework to report the results to inform task 1.3.

TASK 1.2 - UCN (UNIVERSITY COLLEGE NORTHERN DENMARK)

Mapping existing practices in(d)HL

The mapping will focus on existing best practices and less successful practices and representatives of those engaged as “champions” and “survivors” in the project. Practices will be analysed in terms of targets, and population groups as defined in task 1.1.

Search areas

- HL and (d)HL practices in EU and beyond to identify what works and can be replicated and which are the gaps yet to fulfill.
- A starting point will be DHE’s practice catalogue with its 65 initiatives in the field of eHealth and (d)HL.
- Through the analysis, “champions” and “survivors” will be defined, contacted and engaged.

TASK 1.2 UCN (UNIVERSITY COLLEGE NORTHERN DENMARK)

Mapping existing in (d)HL practices

'Champions' and 'survivors'

- Their feedback will deepen the understanding of the most successful elements in HL and (d)HL interventions for the EU Strategy.
- From the analysis 15 key champions and survivors are identified and contacted to be engaged in the project

Suggestions for recommendation:

- Define 'Champions' and 'survivors' and criteria for selecting champions and survivors
- Develop search strategy (search protocol) or adjust?
- Develop a framework to report the results to inform 1.3.
- We go with the targets, and population groups defined in task 1.1?
- We recommend partners suggests 'champions' and 'survivors' if it is not possible to identify enough through the search

TASK 1.2 - UCN (UNIVERSITY COLLEGE NORTHERN DENMARK)

Mapping existing practices in (d)HL

Online workshop

- An online workshop with representatives of practice will be held to identify obstacles, difficulties and areas of improvement
- The workshop will address the issues of citizens' and skills, interoperability, and integration of initiatives between healthcare and social services, and management of data by healthcare and social care providers as well as scaling up of individual initiatives at a national level.

Suggestions for recommendation:

- Develop a plan for the workshop
- Set a date in Autumn 2022
- We recommend that partners participate together with the 15 'Champions' and 'survivors'? Or do we recruit representatives beyond?

TASK 1.3 - SEAMK (SEINÄJOKI UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCE)

Analysis of HL levels across the member states

Analysis of HL levels across the member states

- Based on 1.1. and 1.2 – sum up the results and conduct an overall analysis of HL and (d)HL across the EU
- A workshop to validate the results of Tasks 1.1 and 1.2 will be organized with representatives of the Network of Champions identified.
- Partners will look at the existing monitoring mechanisms and indicators to assess health literacy levels existing at the EU and international levels (e.g., HLS-EU model).
- Monitoring and impact evaluation of the best practices from task 1.2 will be performed and the results of these previous experiences integrated into the IDEAHL approach.
- These results will be generated by M10 and will serve as a baseline to set the EU (d)HL Strategy's monitoring and evaluation scheme (task 2.5) and develop a final common EU monitoring model for (d)HL (task 3.3).

TASK 1.3 - SEAMK (SEINÄJOKI UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCE)

Analysis of HL levels across the member states:

Analyse dispersed approaches to monitor assess HL and dHL level

- Tested existing tools and models - HLS-EU, eHLA, eHLQ, M-POHL, HLS19 (existing monitoring and assessment models for HL and (d)HL in EU and international)
- National HL and (d)HL surveys – subnational vulnerable groups
- HL indicators in national/local quality monitoring frameworks and evaluation frameworks of local HL policies, responses, and initiatives

Suggestions for recommendation:

- Only focus on the EU or also international level?
- Do we need to map national HL and (d)HL and HL indicators in monitoring and evaluation frameworks of local policies, responses, and initiatives?
- Decide frameworks needed – in relation to the (d)HL levels and monitoring
- Reuse the same set-up in the two workshops?
- Develop a framework to report the results to inform D. 1.1 (public report)

TASK 1.4 - RMIT (ROYAL MELBOURNE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY)

Improvement and update The EU HL atlas

- Tasks 1.1, 1.2 and 1.3 outcomes will be integrated in the existing EU Health Literacy Atlas, presenting this complex information open access in a highly user-friendly way.
- RMIT will combine WP1 IDEAHL data with this platform to guide policymakers and health practitioners in assessing (d)HL levels when approaching (d)HL policies' formulation/ implementation. This is complemented by the monitoring scheme and indicators of task 3.3.
- An interactive map of Europe (NUTS2 resolution) will be added, through which socio-cultural and policy peculiarities related to the health literacy sector will be visualised.
- Pointing at a specific territorial unit will open an information box with data on these categories (socio-cultural and policy aspects). The tool will also serve as a repository for project results and findings and for those implemented at the EU level and globally across the consortium networks. A tool manager will be appointed from RMIT, and the Atlas will be regularly updated and maintained during and after the project's duration
